

Welcome to Tisdale



Welcome to Tisdale, a thriving community in Northeast Saskatchewan with a powerhouse agricultural sector, an established manufacturing base, and fantastic regional transportation infrastructure. The Town of Tisdale has a population of 3,235 and is located in the Rural Municipality (RM) of Tisdale No. 427. The RM encompasses a land area of approximately 850 km². Together the Town and RM have a population of 4,100. Tisdale has a direct trade area population of nearly 30,000. Over 475,242 people live within a 2-hour drive of Tisdale.

The Tisdale region's competitive advantages include:

- Strong agricultural production
- Excellent services
- Top-notch transportation corridors
- A diverse and active business community
- A business-friendly environment

The community, originally named Doghide, was founded in 1902 and named after the Doghide River which flows through the Town. With the arrival of the railway, the Town was renamed Tisdale in honour of F.W. Tisdale, a prominent employee of CN Rail.

Did you know?

Englishman Henry Kelsey, an early Canadian explorer and welltravelled employee of the Hudson Bay Company, originally explored the area in 1690.

Tisdale is the hometown of Brent Butt, comedian, actor, writer and star of the hit Canadian TV series Corner Gas.

One of the largest operating farm sales in in Canadian history,

is in the RM of Tisdale.



Economic Indicators

Tisdale's strategic location at the junction of two highways and two rail lines – in the heart of the province's most productive agricultural area – provides a solid foundation for local industry. Tisdale businesses and industries enjoy access to major North American trade corridors. Tisdale is just over 2 hours northeast of the province's largest city, Saskatoon.

Agriculture and Agri-Processing

The Tisdale region is an agriculture powerhouse with a long history of successful crop production. Tisdale is in the northeast portion of Saskatchewan's fertile black soil district and is a major producer of cereals, oilseeds and pulse crops. Year after year, producers deliver high quality cereals (wheat, durum, oats, barely, rye), oilseeds (canola, flax), pulse crops (lentils, peas), forage and specialty crops.

Producers

Producers in the Tisdale area know how to make good use of the short but intense growing season. They have adopted innovative and sustainable agricultural practices. They were early adopters of GPS technology and continue to put advanced technology to work in their fields. Many are farming land settled by their great, great grandparents in the early 1900s.

Many area farmers are graduates of the University of Saskatchewan's highly regarded College of Agriculture and Bioresources. They use their expertise to produce safe crops for food, feed, fuels and pharmaceuticals. The result is a diversified crop base, high quality and high yield crops, and sustainable dryland farming practices that ensure the land is healthy and productive for future generations.

Honey Capital of Saskatchewan

Saskatchewan produces approximately 25% of Canada's honey and Tisdale is the Honey Capital of Saskatchewan with a prominent honey production industry since the 1940s. Long, warm summer days with plenty of canola and alfalfa blossoms mean honeybees can produce prolific honey flows. The average yield per hive in Saskatchewan is twice the world average.



Grain Collection Hub

Tisdale is the largest grain collection centre in Saskatchewan. There are 6 inland terminals in the region – Viterra Valparaiso and Tisdale, Richardson Pioneer, Parrish & Heimbecker (Tisdale North and Tisdale South), and the Scoular Company. Together, they handle over 3.5 million tons of grain and process up to 100,000 metric tonnes of pulse and speciality crops a year.



The northeast is a fantastic region for growing crops like canola, oats, and faba beans.

These crops thrive in the region's growing conditions which include moist, cooler temperatures and lots of sunlight.



Agri-Processing

Value-added processing has been identified as a key opportunity for the region. C-Merak Industries is a prime example of a local producer that is seizing the opportunity by buying, selling and trading grains and pulses and adding value by developing food grade ingredients.

Cumberland College offers an Agriculture Sciences Certificate.

Upon completion of this certificate program, students have the option to transfer into year two of Lakeland College's Crop Technology Diploma program.

Over 20% of the workforce in SK Census Division 14 in northeast Saskatchewan is employed in the Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing & Hunting sector.



Manufacturing

Tisdale has a strong manufacturing foundation. Major players include Westeel, a leading manufacturer of liquid storage tanks. Westeel is currently the largest manufacturer of ULC approved fuel tanks in Canada.

Capital I Industries is a leading manufacturer of road building and maintenance equipment. Irving's Machine Repair and Capital I Industries work collaboratively and specialize in fabrication and general repairs, hydraulic cylinder manufacturer and repair, and A-line boring.

6.5% of Tisdale's workforce is employed in manufacturing industries. This compares to the provincial average of 4.5%.

Tisdale Motor Rewinding:

Tisdale Motor Rewinding or T.M.R. was founded in 1979 to provide northeast Saskatchewan with single and three phase motor repairs. T.M.R.'s skilled staff work on motors in the mining, sawmill, pulp mill, seed plant, and farm industries for much of Saskatchewan, Manitoba, and Alberta.

They can redesign and rebuild motors to exact specifications.

Their professional engineering can change a motors horsepower, speed, voltage, or frequency. Additionally, they can provide the proper windings for frequency drive applications, protection against abrasives, and contamination or moisture laden atmospheres that destroy normal windings.

Wholesale

Tisdale has a strong wholesale sector, related primarily to serving the local agriculture industry. In addition to the cluster of grain handling terminals, a number of crop input outlets, such as Soil Tech Services, are well-established in the area.

Rocky Mountain Equipment has been in business for over 30 years. They offer a full line of both new and used agricultural and forestry equipment. They employ over 25 people year-round who provide sales and service.

Finning, the world's largest CAT dealer, is a commercial and industrial equipment supplier. The Tisdale branch offers heavy equipment sales and service plus rentals of forklifts, lift trucks and heavy equipment.

Bee Maid Supplies / Bee Outfitters in Tisdale is one of Bee Maid Honey Ltd.'s two Bee Supply divisions in Western Canada.



Retail

Tisdale has a strong retail sector, the heart of which is found in its downtown. It is full of independent retailers that carry all kinds of unique and speciality items. From women's boutiques to furniture, Tisdale has great shopping. Valle' Men's Wear is a "go-to" shopping destination in the northeast region for men's fashion. Specialty shops include a bakery and deli, charcuterie boxes, a coffee shop with a full espresso bar, a florist and more.

Beeland Co-op operates a grocery store and pharmacy, a home and building store, sport and leisure centre, fuel and convenience store, plus an agro centre, cardlock and bulk fuel.

Professional Services

Tisdale punches above its weight when it comes to offering professional health care services with dental care, optometry, and chiropractor services. Other professional services include two denturists, Northeast Veterinary Services, law offices, and professional accountants. These businesses contribute to Tisdale's role as a hub for services in the Northeast.

Tisdale has an incredible trading area.

Communities like Nipawin and Hudson Bay often access services in Tisdale.

Transportation Infrastructure

Tisdale's strategic location at the intersection of Highways 3 and 35 provides north-south and east-west access to major markets. Traffic volumes currently surpass 9,000 vehicles a day.

Both national railways operate branch lines out of Tisdale: Canadian National (CN) Tisdale and Canadian Pacific (CP) Tisdale are Class 1 Railroads. These two rail lines connect local businesses to international markets. In addition, several shortlines are in the area which help to bring raw products to the Tisdale region.

Highways	 Highway 3 is a major provincial paved undivided highway that runs east-west from the Manitoba border to the Alberta border. Highway 35 is a paved undivided provincial highway. It runs from the US Border near Port of Oungre to Tobin Lake, SK. Both highways are part of the CanAm Highway - an international highway that connects Mexico to Canada through the United States.
Railways	 Class 1 Railroads: <u>CN Tisdale Subdivision</u>: runs from Hudson Bay, SK to Letain (Birch Hills spur). <u>CP Tisdale Subdivision</u>: runs from Goudie, SK to Nipawin, SK. Both CN and CP railways operate intermodal container yards in Saskatoon and Regina. Nearby shortlines include Torch River Rail, Thunder Rail, Northern Lights Rail.



The Tisdale region has a well-educated workforce (ages 25-64) with 60% having postsecondary training or education.




15% of working age adults in the Tisdale region have a trades certificate. This is higher than the provincial average of 12%.
27% have a college/technical diploma, and 17% have a university degree.





Greentree Engineering:

Available Land and Property

Residential:

Tisdale has a wide variety of housing to choose from. Additionally, a variety of recreational properties are available at the several lakes and resort villages in the area.



The Town and RM of Tisdale have 1,820 dwellings according to the 2016 Census of Population.

Approximately 76% are occupied by owners and 17% by renters.



38% of the homes were constructed between 1961 and 1980 and 27% were built between 1991 and 2016. Tisdale has residential lots available in the North end of town in a new subdivision.

The Town of Tisdale has a residential tax incentive, multi-unit tax incentive, and developer residential tax incentive.

These incentives help stimulate residential growth.

Megan Drive is a new subdivision just west of the Tisdale Airport that offers an acreage setting with town amenities.

Caleb Village, a retirement condominium, offers residents independent living options plus a variety of amenities and services. It opened in March 2012 and is located across the street from the hospital.

Tisdale Housing Authority has apartments and houses for rent within the community.

Land for Industrial and Commercial Development:

Utility Providers

Tisdale has capacity. All major components of Tisdale's existing water capacity are adequately sized to accommodate significant growth. The existing treatment capacity and treated storage capacity are adequate to provide for growth in community to a population about 6,000. All three Crown Utilities have a presence in Tisdale. Sask Power and Sask Energy will work with developers to meet their specific project needs.

Water Service Provider	The Town of Tisdale. Municipal water is provided through a modern reverse osmosis system.
	Raw water is provided by two groundwater wells located south of the Town. These two wells can meet the Town's peak day requirements. Both wells draw water from the Tisdale Aquifer which was rated to have a sustainable capacity of 1,500 dam ³ per annum (adequate for a population of about 8,000). The Town currently has a groundwater license allocating 1,200 dam ³ per annum.
Waste Water	The Town of Tisdale. Three membrane treatment units are installed at the water treatment plan. Each unit is capable of producing approximately 17 L/s of treated water. The current capacity of the three existing units is 51 L/s. There is space allocated in the water treatment plan for a fourth unit which would increase the total treatment rate to 68 L/s.
	After treatment, water is stored in one of three potable water reservoirs (total storage = $4,655 \text{ m}^3$). Treatment and storage capacity is sufficient to handle population growth to $6,000$.
Internet Providers	Sask Tel - infiNET fibre optic service is available in Tisdale which provides download speeds of up to 300 megabits per second (Mbps) and upload speeds of up to 80 Mbps. Construction is completed in some areas and in-progress in others.
	Access Communications – provides broadband internet within the Town with download speeds as fast as 450 Mbps and Wireless point-of-sight internet for businesses in rural areas.
	Xplornet - a Canadian wireless carrier and rural internet service provider offers wireless internet services using satellite or 4G technology.

Solid Waste & Recycling

The Tisdale Regional Landfill recently expanded and includes a new landfill cell, leachate pond and compost area. The RM of Tisdale is a partner in the Tisdale Regional Landfill.

Education

Tisdale has excellent schools and a college with a wide range of educational programs.

Tisdale's two schools together educate over 1,000 students each year. The schools are administered by the North East School Division.

Tisdale Middle & Secondary School is located at the

RECPlex – a multi-use facility. On top of having a great academic experience, students are able to participate in a full complement of extra-curricular activities and sports. Tisdale sports teams have a rich history of success in the province.

<u>Cumberland College</u> has 3 campuses in the Northeast: Nipawin, Melfort and Tisdale. They offer a wide range of post-secondary training and education options. Most students can complete their first, and sometimes second year of a university degree program locally.

Their Tisdale campus is located at the RECPlex. They also own the Julien LeStrat Building across the street. A new campus in Nipawin includes a large shop which caters to their trades programming.

Cumberland College has an "Elders-in-Residence" program. These Elders guide Indigenous and non-Indigenous students and faculty and share the understanding of First Nation and Métis ways.

Cumberland College's Continuing Studies and Contract Training is designed to be relevant and responsive to the emerging training needs of industry and employers in the region. Short-term training programs are delivered to ensure the local workforce is safe, current, and professional.

Additionally, Cumberland College provides Adult Basic Education programs, provides some personal interest courses, and they offer free adult English language classes to a growing immigrant population.

Over \$100,000 in scholarships is awarded annually to Cumberland College students.

Health Care and Emergency Services

Tisdale is a safe, friendly community with excellent police, fire, and EMS services. The town's crime rate is one of the lowest in the northeast region.

The Northeast Healthplex is a state-of-the-art facility purposely built to provide a wide range of health services to the Northeast region. The Healthplex houses a medical clinic, dental clinic, optometrist, denturist, and chiropractor. The facility also houses the Community Health Clinic.



The Healthplex is connected to the Tisdale Hospital and Newmarket Manor long-term care racinty making it easy and convenient to receive extended health services such as testing, treatments and acute services.

Tisdale RECplex

The Tisdale RECplex is a multi-use facility that integrates the local high school, community college, library, community health services, and small performance / presentation theatre with existing recreation facilities which include:

- A regulation size arena with capacity for 1,400
- A six sheet curling arena with licensed lounge
- A 1,000 seat auditorium / gymnasium equipped with a kitchen capable of serving more than 500 meals
- A 30 yard rifle, hand gun and archery range
- Several meeting rooms
- A large rotunda area
- An Aquatic Centre: an outdoor 25 metre six lane swimming pool with a one metre diving board, a zero entry beach area, and 20 person whirlpool
- Outdoor amenities: tennis courts, soccer and football fields
